James Bronner: Welcome to Brothers of the Word because brother, you need the word.

And I want to give you a message today from my experience and wisdom as a father and my experience as a son of a great father and having really great parents, mother and father. The message title for the day is "Preparing the Next Generation". Preparing the Next Generation, and if your children are grown or if you don't have any children, this message will still be appropriate for you as you may have grandchildren or you may have nieces or nephews or neighbor's kids or other school kids that you may be around that may look up to you as a mentor, we know that it takes really a village to raise a child. So this message will apply to you in any of those situations and we've never in history had the level and the frequency of school shootings and school violence as we have in modern times. And I really believe seeing this that we need more teaching on parenting. I believe it all starts in the home and we don't really get a lot of teaching on how to be a parent. You don't really get it in school.

How many of you took a class in school anywhere on parenting? You don't even really get it in church. When you get ready to get married, you'll have premarital counseling that'll teach you how to be a good husband or wife, but it don't teach you how to be a good parent. The most you get in parenting classes is just how to bring them into the world by how to go through the birth, but they don't tell you what to do after they're here. So other than changing diapers and that type of thing, but they don't really tell you how to bring up a child. So our teaching on it is very limited even though this is one of the prime jobs that we ever have in this life, is raising up a child in this world, one of the most important things that we do. But yet we have some of the less teaching of anything in life.

In the bible, as great of a leader as Moses was, do you know none of Moses' children got into leadership. Many of you didn't even know Moses had any children. Moses, he had at least two sons at the very minimal numbers, Chapter 3 says these also other generations of Aaron and Moses and the day that the Lord speak with Moses in Mt. Sinai and these are the names of the sons of Aaron. Nadab, the firstborn, Abihu, Eleazar and Ithamar, these are the names of the sons of Aaron. The priests which were anointed whom he consecrated to minister in the priests office and even though Moses lead the children of Israel through the Red Sea and did all of the miracles of the plagues and lead this great nation from Egypt to the Promise Land. Even though he did all of that, his children were not in leadership and the bible here in number three, it says these are the generations of Aaron, his brother, Moses, and it didn't even lift the children of Moses in that chapter. Moses had two sons listed in the bible explicitly Gershom and Eliezer. Aaron's children, they took up the mantle of priest and Joshua took up the mantle of leadership from Moses. Samuel, the same vein, he was one of the greatest prophets in the bible, but Samuel's children caused the people to want a king and to cause the nation to have a different form of government than what God ever intended.

First Samuel Chapter 8 from the NIV version says when Samuel grew old, he appointed his sons as Israel's leaders. The name of his first born was Joel and the name of second was Abijah and they served at Beersheba but his sons did not follow his ways. They turned aside after dishonest gain, accepted bribes and perverted justice.

So all the elders of Israel gathered together and came to Samuel at Ramah. They said to him, "You are old and your sons do not follow your ways. Now appoint a king to lead us, such as all the other nations have." But when they said, "Give us a king to lead us," this displeased Samuel; so he prayed to the Lord and the Lord told him: "Listen to all that the people are saying to you. It is not you they have rejected, but they have rejected me as their king and it wasn't just that they rejected God but they rejected Samuel's children." They did didn't want these children to lead them because they saw them accepting bribes and being dishonest and being unjust. And they didn't want unjust leaders so they demanded a king and it changed the whole plan of

rulership that God had planned for the nation of Israel because the children of Samuel didn't follow in the way of Samuel.

And even in today's times, the church is having a great exodus from our youth in the church and they saw it even back in the Bible days, not only Samuel but all of the great kings. It was a pattern that you would have a good king and then you would have a bad king and you'd have a good king and then you have a bad king and a bad king and a bad king, another good king. They had a hard time keeping the youth coming up in the royal families in the right order and it was almost nowhere in the (00:06:56) that you could find three good kings in a row.

So in today's time, when you look at the statistics, it's the same way with having our youth following the way of their parents and this says 70% -75% of Christian youth, leave the church after high school today, 70% to 75% of Christian youth. Those that grew up in the church they leave the church, three out of four by the time they finish high school and when I grew up and back in that day that you would have your children in the church and then Sunday school and then when they grew up and got married, they would have their children in church and Sunday school but that is no longer the case. Even one-third of the pastor's children nowadays don't go to church as an adult. One-third of pastor's children don't even go to church as an adult and 80% of pastors feel that the ministry has negatively affected their families. Eighty percent of pastors and the majority of preacher's kids, the research show that they need counseling and they face depression at some point in their life. So in even the pastors of the church are having issues in their own home with that next generation and preparing them. Even when you look at mega church ministers now, you don't see their children following in their line coming behind their fathers ready to take over the ministry. So this is a message that needed from the top all the way down to the bottom and preparing the next generation. The word succeed it has two meanings in the dictionary. The first is to accomplish what you are trying to do. The second mean is to come after something in a series and I believe that these two definitions, they really connect to each other because your level of success will be limited if your success dies with you. So without somebody to carry it all without a successor in place, what you do will be limited. We would not be Christians in this church today if Jesus didn't have successors of 12 Apostles that carried the Gospel after He left this physical earth and went out and preached it to all nations.

So to have a certain level of success, he had to have successors and disciples to carry out the Gospel. Even in the business world, they found through the statistics that only 20% of family businesses make it to the second generation and of those that make it to the second generation only 20% of those make it to the third generation. There was a business saying in my father's day that first generation builds a business, the second generation enjoys a business and the third generation destroys the business. So even back 67 years ago, they were still having this problem of preparing the next generation and we've been blessed as a family because we are at the moment preparing and training the fifth consecutive generation in successful entrepreneurship.

And a fellow entrepreneur, he once asked my father, he said, "Mr. Bronner, what will you do or what will Bronner Brothers, what will happen to it if you die one day?" and my father thought about that question and he answered the man, "What do you mean if?" My father understood that he was definitely going to die one day that it wasn't if but it was when? And he didn't wait until he died to have his plan to unfold, to have his children prepare, he began to prepare us even all through his life and he turned over the company and turned over the responsibilities while he was living, so that he could be there to guide us along the way, he didn't wait on an if, he knew it was coming one day and I don't take this subject matter lightly as one of my three lifelong goals is to raise up my children with the same level of readiness as my father and mother raised us, so its one of my three goals in life, so this is a very serious subject personally to me.

And as most of you have know in this congregation, my wife, Stephanie and I, we have seven children together and God has blessed us in our family. And we have three sons, ages seventeen to twenty, so in some very critical years there and we have two teenage daughters as well and out of the five of them that are in that teenage age range. We haven't have one of them that operated a season of rebelliousness, they've always –

And as I was coming up, I would ask parents "What's the biggest age to look out for in your kids so that we could brace ourselves and be ready?" and they pretty much across the boards that those teenage years are going to be the rough, and they get a mind that

they own and you can't tell them nothing and we haven't had one of them that has operated in rebelliousness. And out of the five of them with third headed in to college next year, the three boys and the two teenage girls all have taken a vow to God and they all are still virgins today.

So, we thank God for covering our children, we thank Him for giving us the wisdom in how to bring them up and so, it's just a testimony that the principles that I would go through today, it still works in modern times today and keep in mind that these seven children are not in a private Christian school, they're in public schools where they were riding a bus to school, so they're in public schools all of their life.

And I want to give you four keys that have taken us through five generations in a row of this type of success to properly prepare the next generation and by a show of hands, how many of you are in here wants your children and your grandchildren to go beyond what you are able to do in life? You want them to be more than what you are. If you look around there's almost every hand in here, so I'm going to use that four letter word more, m-o-r-e as an acronym to encapsulate the four principals to preparing the next generation.

So the "M" in more is going to be for mirror. The "O" is going to be for order, the "R" is going to be for relationship and the "E" is going to be for excellence. So, let's start with that first key of mirror. And mirror is talking about living a life before them that you want them to live. President JFK said "For what we are, speaks louder than what we say". So, a lot of times we want to just tell our children to do this and that but it doesn't work that way. They're going to go by what they see you do not by what they hear you say.

And there's a story about Mahatma Gandhi, the political and the religious leader in India. And they said that one day Gandhi would often see the people and they would line up and come to talk with him to get his wisdom and his spiritual and political counsel. So, they say this lady was bringing her son and she stood inline in the hot sun for hours, she finally got in after waiting an hour outside and she got in and finally got to meet the great Gandhi and she said, "Gandhi, I brought my little boy here and he respects you and he looks up to you and he wont listen to me

and he said I want you to tell him to stop eating sugar, he eats too much sugar and he will listen to you Gandhi.”

And Gandhi pondered the situation and he thought about it, he said, “Come back in once month”. She had waited all of this time and travelled for days to get best, I mean he was the leader and it was his terms so she can argue on me, and she said “Okay, I’ll come back”.

A month later, she made the days journey and come back again and waited in the sun for hours again and pressed away through the line and through the people and she came back before Gandhi and she said, “Gandhi, I ask you again please tell my son that respects you to stop eating all of these sugar” she turned to the boy and he said, “Stop eating sugar” and the mother of her was puzzled she said, “Now, why can you tell him a month ago, I didn’t wasted all of this travel”. And Gandhi looked at the mother, he said, “A month ago I was still eating sugar”.

So Gandhi understood that he didn’t want to be a hypocrite that he didn’t want to tell this lady’s son something that he was sneaking back eating Oreos and eating cakes and pies that he understood that this boy respected him and looked up to him and he didn’t want to preach something that he wasn’t leaving himself, so he had to tell him to come back while he got his own self together.

And mirroring the behavior for the next generation is the first and the most impacting of the four keys. The brain has what’s called “Mirror Neurons”. And a recent research study on mirror neurons has discovered that when we see somebody else doing something that there are neurons in the brain that respond as though we’re doing it ourselves, it’s the same response that when you see somebody young, the mirror neurons will fire in your brain and you’ll feel young coming on, so I saw some people yawning in.

And realizing the power of mirroring behavior in front of the next generation, I realized that nobody is perfect but one of my fatherhood goals in life is to live before my children, the type of man that I want my sons to become and my daughters to date and to marry and that is a goal of mine.

And father lived before our eyes the type of light that he wanted us to live and whenever they would ask us in school to write down a mentor and write down why they're your mentor, other kids would think about it and they wouldn't go through Martin Luther King and the president and the pastor and different people, but I would always put the same asset down, it was my father. And I saw something in him that was a very balanced walk of life and I would always write him down as my mentor and my role model because he lived the life before us.

And my son, we were riding in the car one on day and he's really – hit home the power of this principle to me and this was only probably a year ago, like I wish I would have known that earlier and I would taken that a little more seriously, but we were riding in the car and he was in high school and he said, "Daddy, you're great at developing systems and giving us material to read and the stuff you teach us and go over with us" but he said, "Be honest, none of that would have worked if we didn't see you doing what you have told us to do".

He said that peer pressure is too strong in our school. We see all those doing all of this stuff. He said, "It wouldn't have held us. We would have rationalized it" and said "Well, we saw daddy smoking so it must be all right even though he telling us this stuff. We saw daddy running around, so let us go get something" he said, "It would not have held us. All of the things you've told us, all of the books you've given us to read, all of the church you've taken us to all of the seminar" he said, "We would have turned against it and done what we saw everybody else do if we had seen you do something different. And it really ministered to me and we put together a business so he is called the 24hourmba.com to help entrepreneurs because we saw our father develop tens of other entrepreneurs in his life and we sold health products at over 15,000 health food stores because we saw our father take teas and tinctures to sick employees and sick neighbors throughout the years.

My brother, he publishes a magazine, Upscale. The reason he publishes is because for years he saw my father and mother, a publisher show God every show across the living room table and we lead two churches today and the reason is not because our parents drag us to church but because they cleared out our living room furniture and put in folding chairs and they put the church

in our home and had church there weekly, so it was something that we saw with our own eyes and they didn't just take us to Sunday school but they lived the Christian life before our very eyes, showing us how to treat people and how to treat each other and to treat our savior.

And somebody once said, "It doesn't matter how much you speak in tongues, if what you say in English is mean," and when we woke up in the morning we would walk by our mothers room and hear her praying with the prayer partner for over 25 years and we would then walk down and look in the fore and see our father praying under God for guidance for the day. And at this pastoral conference that was a Caribbean fellow and he was teaching the people on fornication and how to keep yourself sexually pure before God and he was talking about all of the reasons not to have sex outside of marriage and he was going to the scriptures he said "This group just says this" and he was telling stories on it and the diseases you could catch and all and he got to the end of it and he said, "I've given you all of the scriptures, all of the stories on it, but to be totally honest with you, just because I've taught this doesn't mean I don't do that".

So we have to be so careful to make sure that we're not just teaching them but we are actually practicing it. And that next principal is that of order, so after mirror then that of order. The number one principle we heard growing up was a priority system of God first, family second and business third. We didn't just hear it but we saw it, mirror it and demonstrate it before us. Your priorities will determine your focus and whatever you focus on will grow. If you focus on your relationship and put time and energy there, you'll have a better relationship and in order to grow, if you focus on making money and you work hard and read up on it and invest wisely your money will grow.

You focus on your spiritual life and consistent in your prayer and steady in word and church attendance and helping others, your spirit will grow. Whatever you focus on will grow in your life and I would remember one time with my youngest daughter, Jade was six-years-old and I had just taken over a new position that was requiring me to travel more. And on my very first trip, I had on my suit and I packed my bag and was headed out of the door and she looked at me and saw me with this bag at six-years-old and

she knew by the size of the bag I would be going multiple days and she'd look at me and I looked in her eyes and there were tear filled. And she said, "Daddy, I miss you already" and when I got on the plane that image just began to flash before me and again, I hear those words and I made a commitment to myself right then, I said, "I'm going to limit this travel that if I can send somebody else or tell a conference to accomplish the same thing then I'm going to stay at home" and I made a conscious decision to prioritize my family.

And pastors often make the mistake of putting the church before their family and that's one of the main reasons that you heard those statistics earlier of why PK's have so much depression and issues that they need counseling on and I heard a big minister recently say that he had to really reprioritize his life and he had to come to the realization he said, "If I don't do a good job preaching to you all that the church border get together and they'll bring in a new preacher that will continue to preach the word of the Lord. But he said, "If I don't do a good job as a father and as a parent that there will be a gap there, the left that nobody can properly feel like me." So he said, "I had to prioritize that which only I could do first".

The third key in that word "more", you had mirror, order, the "R" is for relationship. There's no substitute for a strong relationship with your children and leading them to a strong relationship with God, and young people want to know how much you care before they care how much you know. Our father, he spends so much time with us that when it was time for him to go on vacation we were actually happy that he was leaving. We need a break. This man just training us and smother us, we were just applauding and looking out the windows and "Don't hurry back daddy".

And that's literally how much time that he spent with us. I can never remember a time where I thought to myself "I sure wish daddy could spend more time with". C. Elijah, did you ever remember the time at your life you were a little older? How many fathers can say that today? So when you see us today its no accident, so there's from two of us, we can never remember a time when we said, "We wish daddy would spend more time with us" and that's saying a lot for a multimillionaire who is running businesses and working in the community and working in this church.

And you need to spend enough time with your kids for them to be around you enough of those mirror neurons to really firing in their head and really to give an image, where they can mimic what they see. And sitting down at the dinner table as a family without electronics or television, it's almost a lost practice in today's society. Did you chew it and wanted to just get their plating go to their room and be on their phones and play games and watch television, distracted from the very family table that was the core of a lot of our families in the old days.

And from that family table in our house, it really allowed us to build relationship to a stronger level. I know the games that my children play because we talk about it at the family table, I know the friends that they have because of that dinner table, I know the struggles that they're going through, the aspirations that they have, all because of this dinner time of engaging with them one-on-one.

The same can be said about helping the children and develop a strong relationship with their Heavenly Father. Before I engage with the world everyday, before I ever cut on my phone or talk to anybody I'll go and talk to my Heavenly Father and that will give you guidance and even something's that you might not know how to do because your parents may not have shown you. The Heavenly Father, he is the perfect parent and the perfect father, he'll give you guidance on how to do stuff.

I remember one time, one morning I was in prayer and he had impressed it upon my heart to write one of my children a letter. I didn't know that the child was going through something in his teenage season and he hadn't talked with us about it and I wrote him a letter and I put in at how much I loved him and how proud I was of him and I just set it on his pillow. And when he came in and if he came in and even though he was a grownup teenager, he came in crying and said "You don't know what this letter meant to me. I just had prayed to God about something and I said, "Lord, if you're really real in my life right now can you have my father these words?"

He said "That very next day you put a letter on my bed with those words" he said "I'll never doubt God again" and he carried the letter with him in his wallet, everywhere he went because I was

seeking God that morning, something that a book couldn't tell me how to do, but the leading of his Holy Spirit will tell you what to do even when you don't know what's going on with your child, even if they're not talking to you about it, even though you might not be in that generation and feel like you may not understand, God knows your children, he'll lead and he will guide you if you're just seeking.

The fourth key in that "MORE". Mirror, order, relationship, the "E" is for excellence and this is an "Everybody-gets-a-trophy-generation" well, when they play a sport they just give you a trophy for participating and that's different in our day, you have to do something, you had to play pretty good, you didn't just get a trophy just because you were out there. And they do that, so the kids will have self esteem problem but at the same time, it doesn't reward excellence the same.

It done makes you strive to be better than the average. And my father, he made all of us learn martial arts and part of the reason for that. Well, one was to remove fear. Another reason was because he knew that when we got in this ring with other kids our age. They didn't know what our last name was, they didn't care how much money you had and the way you went to school. They didn't care about any of that who your parents were. All they knew is they will hit or knock your head off.

And it even the playing field totally. You end up without parents, you end up by yourself with somebody to try to knock your head off. And it thought us excellence because we couldn't lean on mommy and daddy. I couldn't lean on anything they have done or accomplished. And we had to develop a certain level of excellence to be able to defend ourselves and to be able to perform at a level when we went get our heads knocked off.

So he trained us and he eliminated excuses and blaming stuff on another people. Then, there was us and this all person, so it was a matter of whether we had studied and practiced and done what we were supposed to do. It would all show up in the ring. Excellence makes room for you in times when jobs and business opportunities are limited. Excellence, it helps you spend out in a chosen field that even if it's crowded. When you shop on Amazon you experience a customer service level of excellence. People love iPhones because they experience a craftsmanship of excellence and an operating system of excellence. They love to work at

Google as one of the favorite places to work at because they have a culture, that's an excellence of a culture.

In the same way, if you can develop excellence in your kid's craft, they will be in high demand wherever they go. And one of my fatherhood goals is to help my children discover their purpose and develop a level of excellence in that area. A lot of time, youth they can't see their own abilities and own gift, their own purpose, but as a parent a caregiver you're able to see that spark of specialness that they have and you're able to point it out to them and help them grow in that and inform them, "You know, you have a gift in this," and help encourage them in that area. And it's up to us parents and mentors to point out those gifts and to help them to develop them to a level of excellence.

So take these four keys with you in developing your children, you grandchildren, your nieces, your nephews, those in your neighborhood, those in your community more. If you want them to more, "M" mirror their behavior. "O" set order, God first, family second, business and career third. "R" for relationship, form a close relationship with them and a relationship up close between them and their God. And then "E", develop a level of excellence in them that'll make room for them wherever they go.

Hey man, I'm going to ask my wife since she is my partner in raising these children and she has birthed seven children in our first 10 years of marriage, doesn't she look good for that? Stephanie Bronner: Praise the Lord, Hallelujah. How many of you know more? Let's say, "More!" I will do more. I will mirror better. I want to hear you, I will mirror better. I will set order. I'll be more careful in my relationships and I will be excellent for the Lord.

I just want to give God praise and thanks because I live in a home that I can honestly say everything he has said. He is not facade, it's all real. And I'm super thankful to the Lord for allowing me the opportunity to be a part of this. So, I guess the Lord wants me to tell you that all of you have the same opportunity to be curse

breakers. Many of you have families, where your mother or your father didn't bring you to church. You are that one out of your family that has sought the Father.

So I'm a PK, so who he was talking about. I was listening real close to make sure he was telling the truth. My father is and was a pastor longer than I've been born. So, I grew in a home when my father was at church all the time, but every bit of that MORE was exactly how he was with us. I wasn't one of those kids that was suffering mentally from having issues when my dad wasn't at home, he was there, he was there. But the thing is, my father's father was not in the church. My father's-father's father was in the church. So at the tender age of 16 my dad said, he heard the voice of God, say, "You going to preach," he said, "No. Not me Lord, no." And he said, He was continuing on his day. He went on and finished doing what he was doing. He remembers it, he's 88 now and remembers that that day he told God, "No, not me." Then he turns 21 and he said, "He is driving a tractor trailer and he remembers what God told him," and he said, "He remembers that God has said, "You will preach." And he said at that point he was so deep in God, that his truck, the breaks wouldn't work fast enough to stop because he was so distracted that he remembers saying, "Jesus!" And all he knows is that his truck was in a ravine right on the edge, just almost over the edge and there was a railroad track down at the bottom.

He said at that point he knew, "Okay Lord, I hear you, I hear you, I hear you. I turned and I turned and I turned, I stopped. I will serve you." At 21, he gave his life to Christ. He said, I know my dad he was called but he wouldn't answer. I know my granddaddy was called and he went in so I'm going to answer the call. My grandfather died at 51. My great grandfather died at 49. My daddy broke the curse, he is 88 living for the Lord and he still has work to do, so you all are curse breakers that MORE, it is real. He is not a Samuel. You are not a Samuel.

All of you walking in the divine grace of the blood of Jesus, they didn't have Jesus with Samuel and Moses. Well, he got the blood of Jesus you all. We can walk in favor; we can walk in the knowledge that we don't have to be cursed. So many of your out there, if anybody just want to stand up and just say, "Lord I will live more." I'm not going to make you come down, but I'm going to ask you to stand up. Just stand up and say, "Lord I am more

for you. I stand here, I am more for you! Lord, I give my MORE for you. Everything I own God is more for you.”

So give yourselves a hand because you just broke the curse. You step in on the devil’s head. You tell him that he is a liar. He can’t have your family. He can’t have your children. He can’t have your health. He can’t have your finances because you have been bought with a price. There is no taking it back. You are more, you walk in more and this sermon just reminded us of who we are in Christ.

So you all, just raise your hands as we begin to give God glory and honor. Lord, you’re so worthy. You’re so wonderful God. We thank you for seeing us before we even knew who we were. Thank you for dying for us, before we could even ask for forgiveness of these sins. So Father, right now we renew our minds. We renew our hearts. We speak with our mouths. What we have said we are more for you and Lord, you’re going to see a difference in our walk, Lord. You’re going to see a difference in our talk. We’re going to speak your word Father. We’re going to begin to create our world with the word of the Lord. We’re going to begin to spit those things that are not as thou they were. We’re going to know within ourselves God that you live and that this is the temple of the Holy Spirit. We’re going to take care of your temple, Lord. We’re going to be that mirrored example in the Earth for you God that our men here will see our good works and glorify you which is in Heaven.

So Father, we thank you right now. We glorify you. We thank you because it is not anything we’ve done that you’ve been so good to us to give us your only begotten son. But God, it is by your grace and your mercy that you saw before we even inhabited this Earth that you are going to be able to take the sin away. That you are going to carry our transgressions on the back of Jesus. And you are going to give it all back, God.
